Eligibility

- ✓ **Dislocated Worker**
 - Has been terminated or laid off, or who has received notice of termination or layoff, and is unlikely to return to a previous industry or occupation; or
 - Has been terminated or laid off, or has received notice of termination or layoff, as a result of any permanent closure of, or any substantial layoff at, a plant, facility, or enterprise; and
 - Is eligible for or has exhausted entitlement to unemployment compensation; or
 - Has been employed for at least 90 consecutive days, but is not eligible for unemployment compensation due to insufficient earnings or having performed services for an employer that were not covered under a State unemployment compensation law;
 - Was self-employed, but is unemployed as a result of general economic conditions or because of natural disasters; or
 - Is a displaced homemaker; or
 - Is the spouse of a member of the Armed Forces on active duty and who has experienced a loss of employment as a direct result or relocation to accommodate a permanent change in duty station of such member
 - An individual temporarily or permanently laid off as a consequence of a disaster or emergency
- ✓ An individual temporarily or permanently laid off as a consequence of the disaster or emergency;
- ✓ A long-term unemployed individual
- ✓ A self-employed individual who became unemployed or significantly underemployed as a result of emergency or disaster
