Eligibility Requirements (one or more):

- Not attending any school as defined by State law
- Authorized to work in the U.S.
- High school dropout
- Pregnant or parenting
- With a disability
- Justice-involved
- Homeless or a runaway
- Involved in any stage of the foster care system
- Low-income and is a recipient of a high school diploma or its equivalent, and is basic skills deficient
- Low-income and is a recipient of a high school diploma or its equivalent, and is an English language learner

IN SCHOOL YOUTH FOR YOUNG ADULTS 14-21 YEARS OLD

Eligibility Requirements:

- Attending a school as defined by State law

 - With a disability (the youth's own income rather than his/her family's income can be used for low income)
 - Involved in any stage of the foster care system
 - Justice-involved
 - Homeless or a runaway
 - Low income
 - Basic skills deficient
 - English language learner
